Biographical Statement

Dr. Alicia Skinner Cook is a Professor in the Department of Human Development and Family Studies at Colorado State University and has served as an active member of the Women's Studies Board and the Gender Curriculum Infusion Project. Dr. Cook is a licensed psychologist and has a long-standing interest in gender issues and mentoring relationships in the context of career development. She has published over 40 journal articles and four books as well as producing numerous technical reports from international projects. Much of her international work has focused on promoting women's leadership potential and career advancement. She was a Senior Technical Consultant on two such projects in Kenya funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development, and directed an International Visitor's Program with a focus on Women as Economic Contributors to Nation Building. She has held a variety of administrative positions at her institution including Associate Dean of the Graduate School, Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs, and Interim Vice Provost for International Programs. Dr. Cook was recognized for the innovative Faculty Mentoring component of her International Development Enhancement Project (funded by the U.S. Department of Education) in 2003 when Colorado State University was selected as the recipient of Andrew Heiskell Award for Innovation in International Education.
